**UAMS Sets SeniorNet July Computer Classes
for People 50 and Up**

LITTLE ROCK — Two computer classes — *Introduction to Computers* and *Fundamentals for Beginners* — and two workshops — *Introduction to Google Photos* and *Tips & Tricks for the iPhone & iPad* — will be taught in July for people ages 50 and older at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) [Donald W. Reynolds Institute on Aging](#).

Classes begin July 6. The schedule is:

- *Fundamentals for Beginners*, Mondays and Wednesdays, July 6-27, 10 a.m. to noon.
- *Introduction to Computers*, Tuesdays and Thursdays, July 7-28, 1-3 p.m.
- *Introduction to Google Photos*, July 11 and 13, 1-2:30 p.m.
- *Tips & Tricks for the iPhone & iPad*, July 19, 21 and 26, 10-11:30 a.m.

Course fees for 16 hours of instruction are \$45 and manuals are \$15. The cost for workshops vary depending on the number and length of classes. The program is administered by SeniorNet, a nonprofit volunteer group. Classes are in Room 2156 at the UAMS Institute on Aging, 629 Jack Stephens Drive, Little Rock.
